1. How Students and Faculty Can Form a United Front for a Racially Just University

Workshop description: Our goal is to make a difference in establishing the priorities for budgeting and spending. How do we build support for our ideas inside and outside the university? We will look briefly at the analysis of university budgets provided by Howard Bunsis over the last few months and spend the bulk of our time working on how we communicate those priorities and win allies to a campaign to change the way university budgets are spent.

3. Introduction to Non-Violent Direct Action

Workshop description: Why are those people always causing trouble? This interactive, participatory workshop will introduce you to the theories and principles of direct action from a practitioner point of view. While we will not be doing a deep dive into the theory of nonviolent resistance, you will be introduced to theories and principles of direct action and campaigns through a plethora of examples. We will explore what is direct action, and how is it similar and different from civil disobedience. We draw from the broad history of social movements, including anticolonial, indigenous sovereignty, labor, Civil Rights, student, LGBTQ, independent living, Movement for Black Lives, environmental activism, anti-racist, youth organizing, and many others. Whether or not you participate in direct actions, this will allow you to understand it better, talk about it, be inspired for positive change, and share that information with your colleagues and community.
